Proclaiming and Teaching

Colossians 1:24-2:15

Main Idea: Living as a mature follower of Christ involves warnings, encouragement, thanksgiving, joy, and hope.

Main Practice: Stay true to who Christ is and what He taught.

Main Teaching: Colossians 1:24-2:15

Refocus

with Praise

Read, sing or meditate on the first and fourth verses of the song, In Christ Alone.

In Christ alone, my hope is found He is my light, my strength, my song This Cornerstone, this solid ground Firm through the fiercest drought and storm What heights of love, what depths of peace When fears are stilled, when strivings cease My Comforter, my All in All Here in the love of Christ I stand No guilt in life, no fear in death This is the power of Christ in me From life's first cry to final breath Jesus commands my destiny No power of hell, no scheme of man Can ever pluck me from His hand Till He returns or calls me home Here in the power of Christ I'll stand

Prayer

Have someone pray for your group as you study this passage and for your discussion during this gathering.

1. Have a group member read Colossians 1:24-2:15 aloud.

2. Discuss any questions or insights that this week's sermon offered.

3. Who is the smartest, wisest person who ever lived? Paul gives us the answer in chapter 2, verse 3 and Paul tells us why this is important to know in chapter 2, verses 2+4. Where else in Scripture do we learn about Christ's wisdom/knowledge? See and discuss John 1:1-3, 1:14, Romans 11:33-36, 1 John 5:20.

4. Paul tells the Colossians that the person they believe in is the fulfillment of prophecy, (the Christ) the Savior, (Jesus) and Ruler (Lord). Don't drift away from any of these aspects of Jesus. Keep these foundational truths in order to grow and mature as Christ followers. What should be our responses be to these descriptions of who Jesus is?

5. In verses 2:8-10, Paul tells us not to be carried away by worldly philosophies (ideas about knowledge, truth, reality, existence, joy and morality). Paul is saying that Christ is not only the Savior of our souls, but the most knowledgeable and truthful teacher about all of life. Where else do we see the all-sufficiency of being "in Christ alone"? Helpful scriptures: Psalm 16:11, John 14:6, Matthew 7:13, 13:44-45, 2 Peter 1:3-4.

6. Paul points in this Scripture to the future reality of our eternal life. By faith in Christ, who overcame the debt of our sin, we have already been united in Him in his burial and resurrection. Where else do we read about this reality that is future, but that is present in believers already? See John 6:37-40, 11:25-26, Romans 6:3-5, 8:10-11, 1 Corinthians 15:21-22.

Practice

Encourage each other always to rely on the truth of Scripture to mature in Christian living and the Christ following life.

Take some time and break into groups of 2-3. Prayerfully speak encouraging words to one another by answering the following question. What spiritual gifts or growth do you see in each other?

For Further Focus

Most commentators believe that the "mystery," Paul refers to in chapter 1, verse 26 is the mystery of bringing Gentiles into God's Kingdom. Salvation is now available, by faith, to all...not just Jews and not by works of the law. This "mystery" is revealed in Christ. Look at the following Scriptures as you ponder this: Isaiah 49:6, Ephesians 3:4-6, Galatians 2:15-16, 3:24-29.
