



WHAT IS CIY MOVE?

The High School Ministry attends the CIY MOVE Conference every year. This week is the biggest event we do all year for Eastview's students currently in 8-11th grade. The whole week is designed to amplify the call of Christ on students' lives to become Kingdom Workers. The week will include high-energy worship services, some of the nation's best speakers, small groups, recreation time, food, fun, and more (You can check out this year's theme at ciy.com/move). God's Word will be clearly communicated through artists, musicians, videos and other various means. Everything is designed to help students worship, encounter, and grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ. This can be a very emotional, freedom-filled week. WHERE IS CIY MOVE?

This event takes place on the campus of Hope College in Holland, Michigan.

WHEN IS CIY MOVE?

June 22 - June 27 (leave in the morning on the 22nd and return in the late morning on the 27th).

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST? HOW DO I SIGN UP?

Registration closes: March 23, 2020

Cost: \$435 (\$200 non-refundable deposit required to register) Full payments is required by May 18th and no cancellations can be processed after this date.

WHAT DOES A TYPICAL DAY LOOK LIKE AT MOVE?

Each day the students will attend a morning session where they will participate in a worship service that includes the theme for the day, games, worship, and a message given by the various speakers. Students will also be briefed on the activities being put on that day during the afternoon free/recreation time.

At the conclusion of this large session, students meet with their small groups for some reflection and daily challenge time before heading to lunch. In the afternoon, students

have the freedom to choose from a list of workshops, sports activities, shopping in the downtown area or just hanging out with friends.

After dinner, students will be challenged in their faith journey through high-energy, interactive worship and dynamic preaching with different speakers each night. Students will then conclude their evening in their small groups discussing their day.

WHAT ARE NEXT STEPS AFTER MOVE?

Baptism: When we get back, we hope all students who feel led to be baptized will talk with their parents and our staff. We would love to help them walk through this special next step in their faith journey!

Small Groups & Serving: Every student will get a link via text on the last day of MOVE to allow them to sign up to join a small group and to serve at Eastview. This journey of following Jesus is a personal one, but never a private one. We were all created to do life with each other in community! Eastview also believes that serving in our church every week is one of the most effective ways to live out your faith and increase your involvement. We will be sharing more about serving in the weeks following MOVE.

CIY FAQs:

Is there a way to follow the week and get updates of what's happening at MOVE? Yes! You can join our Eastview High School Ministry Facebook Group page and Instagram feed for pictures and updates throughout the week. We will provide a link to a daily recap video on both of our social media sites. You can also download the CIY MOVE app to see real-time schedules and updates each day.

What if my child has to take medication?

Students are responsible for their own medication. If special arrangements need to be made with your student's medication, please email mroberts@eastview.church with the details of your request.

What do sleeping arrangements look like?

We are staying in the dorms at Hope College Holland, Michigan. There will be one dorm for boys and one dorm for girls. **Each student will be responsible for bringing a pillow and bedding for a single mattress.

What kind of supervision will there be?

For MOVE, your student will be put in a small group with an adult leader. In addition to small group time, these groups will travel together, room together and sit in the main sessions together. Students will be required to check-in with their small group leader throughout the day as well. Staff, medical professionals, small group leaders and security personnel stay in the dorms with the students.

Can my child invite a friend who does not attend Eastview?

Absolutely! This is a great event to invite friends to!

How much money should I send with my student?

Usually students bring between \$50-\$75 for coffee/snacks/eating out/shopping at free time while they are at the conference. This includes three “on your own” meals: lunch on the bus trip to MI, lunch on Thursday, and breakfast on the bus trip home on Saturday.

What type of transportation do you use?

We will be taking charter busses with bathrooms on board.

How are small groups formed?

Small groups are formed by combining 2 sources: current small groups (ones that meet throughout the school year) and the list of 3 students each applicant names as their “small group friend requests”. We do our very best to honor the friend requests so that each student has at least 1 of their requests in their group. Please understand that this will sometimes lead us to adjust current small groups FOR THE WEEK OF MOVE ONLY.

How do you determine room assignments?

Very little time is required to be in the dorm rooms other than getting ready and sleeping. Therefore, room assignments are determined by the student’s small group in order for small group leaders to better meet with and supervise their group.

How will I receive communication once my student is registered?

You will receive a confirmation e-mail once your student has successfully registered for the trip. Any further communication including additional announcements or information will come through e-mail or a MOVE specific REMIND texting group.

In an effort to keep our trip to Holland, MI smooth and organized, please follow these guidelines when packing for MOVE. Students are responsible for everything they bring including anything that may get stolen, lost, or broken. Make sure ALL of your luggage is clearly labeled with either luggage tags or duct tape that has your name on it.

What should my Student bring?

You can take **4 total pieces of LABELED** luggage on the trip. They are as follows:

- 1 backback or drawstring bag (backpacks are not allowed in the main sessions)
- 1 suitcase
- 1 snack bag
- 1 bedding bag

Backpack Packing Suggestions:

- Warm stuff: jacket/sweat shirt
- A water bottle – Students will be active and on the move most of the day. It is important that they remember to stay hydrated.
- \$50-\$75 at least for snacks, coffees, on your own meals, CIY merchandise, etc.
- Bible, journal, and a few pens/pencils.

Suitcase Packing Suggestions:

- 4 outfits for daytime activities (appropriate active wear suggested)
- Light jacket or sweatshirt -- Temperatures in Michigan can get chilly.
- Sportswear and equipment, as desired for free-time and tournaments
- 5 “nicer” outfits for evening sessions (casual, something you’d wear to school)
**Friday: dress-up night (not required!). Guys: pants or dress shorts and a collared shirt. Ladies: Many girls wear dresses (Please see CIY dress code for appropriate guidelines!)
- Swimwear: if you plan to use the swimming pool -- **girls NO bikini's, Guys NO Speedos.
- Toiletries (including bathroom towels, soap, sunscreen, bug spray and OTC meds)
- Flashlight
- Playing cards, etc.
- Talent show prop—any small items needed for talent show
- Box fan for room (especially guys! – guy’s rooms are not air-conditioned)

Bedding Packing suggestions:

- Twin-size bedding or sleeping bag (put in black trash bag labeled with first and last name on duct tape)
- Blanket (especially for girls – they may have air conditioning that can make the rooms cold!)
- Additional trash bags for repacking bedding for trip home!

For the Bus:

- Pillow
- Backpack
- Snacks
- **MONEY for meals must be WITH YOU while you travel!**

What NOT to bring/wear: *WHEN IN DOUBT, LEAVE IT AT HOME!*

- Alcohol, cigarettes, drugs
- Short shorts
- Sagging pants

- Bikinis
- Miniskirts
- Spaghetti straps/strapless/low cut tops
- E-cigarettes

Rules

Please Respect authority (ECC Staff, Volunteers, Hope College staff, MOVE Staff, etc.) and respect others (do not bully, haze or harass anyone). ECC Staff reserves the right to determine what is and what is not bullying, hazing or harassing.

Sleep in your assigned dorm rooms following lights out policies for safety and security purposes. Girls should be in the girls' dorms only, and guys should stay in the guys' dorms only. If you are found in the wrong dorm - **This will warrant an immediate dismissal from MOVE (at the guardian's expense).**

Clothing should be a respectful representation of your environment. Sometimes a leader or staff member may ask you to change your attire if decided it is inappropriate.

During free time, students and leaders are expected to stay on campus or in the adjacent uptown area of Holland. In order to leave campus, they **MUST** have their small group leader's permission and must contact them when they get back to campus. No public transportation, Taxi service or Uber are to be used for any reason.

The following are **NOT ALLOWED** at MOVE: Alcohol, tobacco of any kind, illegal drugs, paraphernalia or improperly used prescription drugs, fireworks and weapons of any kind. — **This will warrant an immediate dismissal from the conference (at the guardian's expense).**

ECC Staff reserves the right to immediately dismiss and send home a student. In this case, a guardian will need to arrange to pick up the student in Holland at their expense.
